2023 marks our 4th year of running the Neighborhood Produce Program, During our transition to our new farm we are proud to have been able to continue this program delivering fresh produce directly to food insecure households in the East End.



16 of our 30 NPP households self reported improved health outcomes as a result of participating in the program



26 of the 30 households reported they are more confident cooking with fresh produce since joining the NPP

Common Market Partnership

Our Partnership with Common Market has been ongoing for four years. During our transition to the new farm, Common Market has enabled us to sustain our free food distribution through the Neighborhood Produce Program.

Pre-K Produce Program


Our Partnership with Ninfa Lorenzo Early Childhood Center started in 2017, then took a hiatus due to the pandemic. We are delighted to announce the resumption of our produce box deliveries to Ninfa Lorenzo Preschool, starting February 2023.



Move to new site

On September 1st 2022, we officially began our 40 year land agreement with Harris County. Our new 1.5 acre piece of land located at 5715 Canal street, only one block from the old farm, is the new home for our urban farm, Finca Tres Robles. Land security remains one the biggest barriers to urban farming in Houston and as we enter into a 40 year lease on this new piece of land, we recognize the magnitude of this opportunity. This achievement is a reflection of the impact the farm has had since its founding as well as the community's support for the integral and worthy part it plays in the East End Community.

We are profoundly grateful for the overwhelming support we have received for our Capital Campaign to build our new farm. Your generosity has brought us to the brink of achieving our goal, and we are truly blown away by your commitment and belief in our mission. Together, we are reshaping the food system of our East End neighborhood.





The New Finca




The infrastructure at the new Finca Tres Robles will include

- Storage






2023 INCOME **BREAKDOWN**
