NPP Expansion and Supplemental Boxes

In 2024, we expanded the Neighborhood Produce Program (NPP) to include supplemental boxes every other delivery or once a month. These boxes reflected what families told us they needed most—tortillas, honey, more meat, and extra vegetables to round out their meals. For Thanksgiving, we were especially grateful to be able to share a whole chicken with each household, helping make the holiday feel a little more abundant.

2024 Recap

Growth of the Team

We welcomed two key team members in 2024 who have already made a big impact—our Farm Manager and Development Manager. Their leadership and dedication have strengthened both the day-to-day work on the farm and the long-term sustainability of our mission. With their support, we're better equipped to grow more food, build deeper relationships, and bring our vision to life.

Salsa De Mayo

Our 2nd annual Salsa De Mayo was one to remember—with over 350 neighbors coming together to celebrate. Just days after a derecho storm swept through Houston, leaving many in our community without power. Rather than cancel, we transformed the event into a space of resiliency—offering drinking water, phone charging stations, and a hot meal. This was also our last Salsa De Mayo without a farm, marking the end of one chapter and the beginning of something new.



Growth of Perennials

In 2024, our Perennial community grew from 18 to 44 members. We gathered over drinks at Equal Parts and shared a cozy dinner at Tiny Champions, taking time to connect, reflect, and dream together. These moments reminded us that this work isn't just about food—it's about the people who make it possible.

- 720 additional boxes delivered to Ninfa Lorenzo

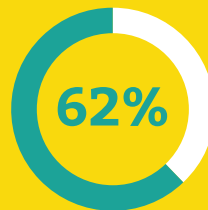


Pounds of Food Distributed

2024 marks our 5th year of running the Neighborhood Produce Program. During our transition to our new farm we are proud to have been able to continue this program delivering fresh produce directly to food insecure households in the East End.

Health Impact: What Participants Are Saying

"I've lost about 25 pounds. The food is helping with controlling my diabetes."

"Sí, como mejor. Tengo mejor digestión. Me cae bien la comida."
(Yes, I eat better. I have better digestion. The food is good for me.)

"Since there are chronic diseases in my family, including hypertension, obesity and prediabetes, healthy foods have helped us maintain a better quality of life, achieving a notable change since we started receiving the food boxes. The health of my adult relatives and my niece has changed, reducing the use of medications that were previously prescribed, and obtaining better digestion of prepared foods."

These reflections highlight the real, personal impact of access to fresh, nutritious food—supporting better health outcomes and improved quality of life for our neighbors.



"The First of Many" Capital Campaign Update

Construction Updates

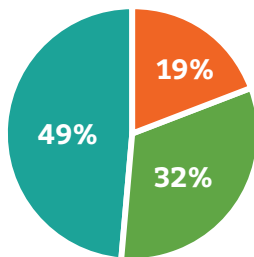
In 2024, we made major strides toward bringing our new farm to life through our First of Many Capital Campaign. The frame of our building is now complete, and we've begun the process of moving soil from our original farm—carrying with it the history, microbes, and care that have sustained our work from the beginning. This isn't just a construction project—it's a homecoming. Every beam and every shovel of soil reflects years of community support and shared vision. We're on track to open our new farm in April 2025, creating a permanent space for food, health, and connection to thrive in the East End for generations to come.

We're also proud to share that we have reached a critical milestone of raising over 80% of our Capital Campaign in 2024 and will officially complete the campaign in 2025. Thanks to the unwavering support of our community, every dollar needed to bring this vision to life has been raised. From longtime supporters to first-time donors, this achievement is a testament to the collective belief in the power of local food and community-rooted change. We're deeply grateful—and look forward to seeing you at the farm next year.

Expanded Food Access:

With the opening of our new farm in April 2025, we're transforming food access in the East End by evolving our Neighborhood Produce Program (NPP) into the more comprehensive Neighborhood Food Access (NFA) Program. What began as a delivery service will be a multi-faceted initiative that includes:

- ▶ **Clinic Referrals** – Fresh produce prescriptions through our partnership local health clinics (*will serve 30 households*)
- ▶ **Home Delivery** – Continued bi-weekly home delivery service for households facing mobility barriers (*will serve 75 households*)
- ▶ **In-Store Shopping** – A dignified, choice-based experience with reloading gift cards for enrolled households and a tiered pricing model open to anyone (*will serve 50 households*)



This expanded approach will allow us to meet neighbors where they are and ensure access to healthy, affordable food for all.

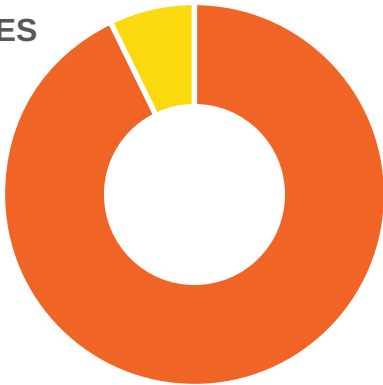
